Ms. Kathleen Wiseman is a faculty member at the Bowen Center for the Study of the Family, formerly the Georgetown University Family Center. She is the founder and president of Working Systems, Inc., a founding member and past president of the Family Firm Institute. Wiseman is a cofounder of Navigating Systems, a course for lawyers, accountants, trust officers and family office executives who want to learn more about family and how families predictably function. Wiseman was in partnership with Charles Collier of Harvard University teaching a course titled Working with Families of Wealth.
